

The Gerda Emergency Plans Box (EPB)™

The Emergency Plans Box is designed to provide a place to store information on your premises plans, such as fire exit routes, emergency isolation points, location of specific hazards – to enable the Fire and Rescue Services to have immediate access to this information and allow safer fire fighting. It is designed for internal locations where weather resistance is not an issue and where security issues are not as high.

For areas where security is of greater concern, public locations or for security boxes that are to be placed externally and are required to be weather resistant, please see the Gerda PIB or Gerda High Security PIB box

Features include:

- Steel construction designed to hold A4 plans and information
- Break glass facility
- Photo-luminescent signage to assist in the event of poor visibility
- Emergency Response Pack included

The EPB™ is accompanied by the Emergency Response Pack Guidance Manual – a comprehensive guide on how to most effectively populate your plans and information so that attending fire crews can readily assimilate the information. This information has been put together by leading professionals in fire safety.

Please note – unlike the Gerda PIP and Gerda Security PIB the Gerda EPB does not operate on the unique One Key® System for the Fire & Rescue Service.

Specifications:

- For use in internal locations
- Square in design with smooth edges
- The EPB is constructed of steel in a Poppy Red Finish RAL 3002
- The handle is made of aluminium alloy.
- The door handle is attached to the right side of the door and is positioned centrally
- Internally there is a Velcro strap for holding your plans and information in place
- 400mm high x 300mm wide x 90mm deep

As part of the Premises Information Box™ (PIB)® System, users are provided with a guidance manual containing best practice guidelines on how to populate a building's plans and information for attending fire crews.

This guidance includes a CD of symbols to assist with the population of plans - it is advisable to consult with your local Fire Authority with reference to their preferred symbolism.

The guidance and symbols have been developed with experienced fire service professionals.

It is the responsibility of the building owner or manager to ensure that their premises plans and information for their property are up to date. This may be carried out at the time of the fire risk assessment review and whenever an update is required.



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
